Thought of the Week:

Fasting can change the course of history!

Thank you for all the help at our last two funerals. The workers, those that furnished food and the CCD Children for setting up the tables.

Why Fast?

For a more recent example, in 1940 during World War II, Germany overran Holland and attacked Belgium, driving the opposing French, English and Belgian forces to the sea. The Germans pursued the French and English across the French frontier with an air, tank and infantry “blitzkrieg,” trapping nearly 400,000 Allied forces at Dunkirk. King George called for a national day of prayer and fasting in Britain and France for the hopelessly stranded British and French troops. Archbishop of Canterbury led prayers from Westminster Abbey. Shocked at the plight of their soldiers, the British people stopped everything to pray and fast. The result was that Hitler (for an unexplained reason) halted the advance of his dreaded panzer division for three days. The normally blustery English Channel remained calm while England evacuated the troops. 340,000 Allied troops were rescued in nine days.

Fasting can change the course of history!

- Fasting opens up our hearts to conversion
 - Fasting gives weight to our prayer intentions
 - Fasting strengthens us in resisting temptations
 - Fasting and prayer promote peace in our hearts and peace with one another
 - Fasting teaches us the difference between “wanting” and “needing”
 - Fasting reminds us of the plight of the poor and for many in the world who are perpetually hungry
 - Fasting and prayer can free us from addictive behavior
 - “Fasting will lead us to a new freedom of heart and mind.” — Fr. Slavko Barbaric O.F.M
 - Fasting invites the Holy Spirit in to heal our hearts, our relationship with God and our relationship with others
- With all fasting, we strongly recommend consulting your physician—as everyone’s physical health is unique.

Souper Bowl of Caring is an ecumenical, youth-led movement that empowers congregations and faith groups to collect dollars and food for local charities. Since 1990, groups throughout the country have teamed up around the time of the Super Bowl to be a champion for their neighbors in need. This event is a simple and

meaningful way to learn about the needs in the community and to do something to help.

I believe this movement is special and would like to invite you to get involved.

Participating is easy. It can be as simple as making an announcement one week and collecting from your congregation, school or civic club the next week. One canned good or one dollar per person can make a huge difference. Here is an example of one way to participate:

- After worship services on Super Bowl Sunday, February 7th, have volunteers stand at the exits and accept donations, or take a collection during the service.
- Send donations directly to MTKO or to another nonprofit organization of your choice.
- Report donations to www.souperbowl.org so they are included in national totals.
- Enjoy the football game knowing you've helped those in need!

Year of Consecrated Life continues until February 2, 2016.

THe nature of the “presidential” parts requires that they be spoken in a loud and clear voice and that everyone listen to them attentively. Therefore, while the Priest is pronouncing them, there should be no other prayers or singing, and the organ or other musical instruments should be silent.

For the Priest, as one who presides, expresses prayers in the name of the Church and of the assembled community; but at times he prays only in his own name, asking that he may exercise his ministry with greater attention and devotion. Prayers of this kind, which occur before the reading of the Gospel, at the preparation of the Gifts, and also before and after the Communion of the Priest, are said quietly.
